Background

- Return of TVET to the development agenda
- UNESCO Ministerial Roundtable on Education and Economic Development (19-20 October 2007)
- Crucial role of skills development for employability and TVET in achieving EFA, LLL, ESD, MDGs, etc.
- TVET is an integral part of UNESCO's mandate in education

- Right of all to have access to high quality and relevant TVET programmes, especially women and girls, the disadvantaged, marginalised and other excluded groups
- TVET is one of three EFA building blocks in UNESCO
- And yet: only 16 of UNESCO's 193 Member States have to date ratified the Convention on Technical and Vocational Education (1999)

Developing a UNESCO TVET Strategy

- 179th Session of the Executive Board of UNESCO (April 2008) adopted Decision 49 calling on the Secretariat to develop a strategy on TVET
- Strategy to presented at the 181st Session of the Executive Board (April 2009)
- Strategy to guide UNESCO to provide most effective assistance to its Member States with regard to TVET

- Series of consultations, in collaboration with the German government, to assist UNESCO's Education Sector in developing a strategy:
 - Interested UNESCO Member States
 - Donor agencies
 - Individual resource experts
- Expert Consultation Meeting in Bonn (12-13 January, 2009) is part of this consultation process
- Organized by UNESCO Headquarters in partnership with BMBF, and in cooperation with the German Commission for UNESCO and UNESCO-UNEVOC International Centre for TVET
